
Please note that Members' Night has been moved up to the May meeting instead of June.

To prepare your slides, hold them as they are to be viewed. Place a dot in the lower left corner. When you put the slide in the slide tray, the dot should be visible in the upper right corner.

Digital images should be sRGB, 72 ppi, 1024 pixels for a horizontal image, 768 pixels tall for a vertical image.

#### **Cristina Mittermeier**

How to Shoot Your Passion: Techniques and Ideas for Social, Environmental and Cause-Related Photography

Photographer and conservationist Cristina Mittermeier uses her camera as a passport to document the complex issues where conservation of wild nature and human needs intersect. Her subjects range from indigenous people of the Amazon to climate change and ocean conservation. Cristina uses her passion for photography to influence the fate of our planet's natural resources and is now a Sony Artisan of Imagery, one of only seven photographers representing Sony's new cameras.

Among many other awards and recognitions she has been named 2010 *Nature's Best* Conservation Photographer of the Year and is the recipient of the 2010 North American Nature Photographers Association Mission Award. *Outdoor Photographer* magazine selected her as one of the 40 most influential nature photographers of our generation for her contributions to the creation of the discipline known as conservation photography.

She has edited 20 coffee table books on conservation for CEMEX and this year she will author her first book with *National Geographic*, *Sublime Nature*: *Photographs that Awe and Inspire*. For more details go to her website: **http://www.cristinamittermeier.com**.

# In Memory of Sid Georgiou

### December 21, 1939-April 9, 2014

SID GEORGIOU WAS A TREASURED MEMBER of both the New York City Sierra Club Photography Committee and the Park West Camera Club. He loved photography, and all the friends and connections he made at both groups. He contributed so much to all of us and enjoyed doing it. He was a member of the NYSCPC Board and volunteered his time and energy for many of our committees. He helped hang our Calumet shows, catered the refreshments at our members' nights and knew all the hidden corners and shelves at Trader Joe's.

Sid's parents were Nick Georgiou (of Cyprus) and Fanny Fishbone (of Ukraine). Though they were immigrants, their common language was English, the language Sid grew up with. Through his parents, he experienced both cuisines, and cooking became a big passion of Sid's. These were skills he would put to future use for both camera clubs. He grew up mainly in Port Washington, NY, a town he loved and where he made many of his early close friends. He graduated from Hofstra University and then earned his degree from Brooklyn Law School. He became a self-employed personal injury lawyer. He met his wife, Ellen, in the early 1970s during a July 4th weekend in the Hamptons, where he enjoyed cooking for large groups of friends. They were married in 1974. Their daughter Alesia was born in 1983. The family settled in Greenwich Village, a neighborhood that Sid loved, where he lived for the rest of his life. He was a familiar face at "neighborhood institutions" such as Porto Rico Coffee, Ottomanelli's and Zito's bakery. He was a proud native New Yorker.

He loved to travel to our nation's national parks. Among the national parks he visited were Arches, Big Bend and Denali. Besides photography, he was also a history buff, a political debater, an animal lover, and of course, a lover of cooking. They were his greatest passions in life. It was always a joy to hear him talk about what he loved. We all enjoyed his company. He leaves behind an extensive network of friends who knew and loved him. We will miss him.

Sidney Georgiou's family will hold a memorial for him in NYC on Saturday, June 28, 2014, from 2:30–5:30 pm, at the Westbeth Community Room, 55 Bethune Street, New York, NY 10014. To get to the center by subway take the #1 train to Christopher Street or the L train to Eighth Avenue.

In celebration of his life, his photographs will be displayed and friends are invited to share memories of him. It will be an informal event. Sid did not want any kind of religious service. You are welcome to share the memorial information with anyone who may wish to attend. If there are any stories in particular that you'd like to share, please e-mail them in advance of the memorial so that a program may be composed.




