

- 4. Email the photos as attachments (not embedded) to sierraphotonyc2@gmail.com.

When you join the Zoom call on September 29, use the name you used to label the photos as your participant name, so that we can announce your photos.


Mike will talk about his experience of being a professional photographer for over 30 years and photographing Acadia National Park (Maine) for the past fifteen years.

October 7, Thursday

Central Park Conservatory Garden & Harlem Meer

See October perennial flowers in the garden, woods, lake, and reflections in the Meer. Meet 1:30 pm inside the East 105th Street gate entrance. Shoot until dark (about 6:30 pm); perhaps dinner afterwards. Subway: 6 train to 103rd Street Station. Bus: M1, M2, M3, M4 or M106 (from West Side).

October 21, Thursday

Prospect Park (Southeast), Brooklyn

See woods, ponds, falls, birds, lake, people and late-day light at Audubon Center Boathouse area and Prospect Park Lake. Stroll 2.5 to 3 miles through the Southeast section, starting from the Lincoln Road entrance and finishing at the Prospect Avenue subway station. Meet 1:30 pm outside of the Prospect Park subway station entrance on Lincoln Road. Shoot until dark (about 6:30 pm). Subway: B, Q trains to Prospect Park station; use exit stairs at front of train.

October 28, Thursday

The High Line Park (Chelsea), NYC

See autumn nature above the city. Hike about 20 blocks (north to south) from West 34th Street to Gansevoort Street. Various afternoon meeting times at different park entrances.

12 noon: West 34th Steet entrance near 12th Avenue. Subway: 7 train to 34th Street-Hudson Yards.

1:30 pm: West 30th Street entrance between 10th & 11th Avenues. Subway: A, C & E trains to 34th Street.

3:00 pm: West 23rd Street entrance between 10th & 11th Avenues. Subway: C & E trains to 23rd Street.

Shoot until dusk, about 5:30 pm; perhaps dinner afterwards.

Visitor info and map: https://www.thehighline.org/visit/. The High Line is crowded and passages are congested; tripods are a bad idea. Bring good walking shoes, rain gear, snacks and water.

November 4, Thursday

Central Park, The Pond and North Woods

See colorful woods, pond reflections, stream and waterfalls. Long stroll through park. Meet 1:00 pm at West 103rd Street entrance. Shoot until dark (about 5:00 pm); perhaps dinner afterwards. Subway: 6 train to 103rd Street Station. Bus: M1, M2, M3, M4, or M106 (from West Side).

November 17, Wednesday

Paulus Hook Exchange Place, NJ

Watch moonrise above the Manhattan skyline at sunset (4:36 PM) as seen from New Jersey. Meet 3:00 pm at New York Waterways Brookfield Place Ferry terminal at Vesey Street, Battery Park City on the Hudson River. Purchase round trip ticket to "Paulus Hook" for 3:30 pm departure. Adults \$14, Seniors (62+) \$13. Return via NYC Ferry at 7:15 pm; perhaps dinner in NYC afterwards. Subway to Brookfield Place: 1, 2, 3 trains to Chambers Street Station. Also, there is a "Downtown Connection" shuttle to the ferry.
