Upcoming Speaker Event

Kah-Wai Lin – The Art of Landscape Photography Tuesday, March 17th - In-Person & on Zoom

Kah-Wai Lin is a nature photographer, ocean explorer, documentary film producer, and wildlife conservationist based in New Jersey. He has led hundreds photography workshops worldwide, delivered over 300 international seminar presentations, and received more than 200 global photography awards. Widely recognized as a leading figure in the photography community, Kah-Wai reaches a global audience of over 300,000 followers across his social media platforms. In recognition of his contributions to photography and wildlife conservation, he was awarded a Certificate of Special Congressional Recognition by the U.S. Congress, and the Medals of Merit from the Government of Mongolia.

In this seminar, Kah-Wai shares insights on seeing the unseen and crafting compelling landscape images. He will explore how to use light to evoke visual emotion, long exposure to create a sense of movement, field of view to shape perspective, and composition to build visual continuity and tell a cohesive story.

Upcoming Outings


Outings outside the city require carpooling. Call Leader Charles Dexter, 917-593-8381 for car meet up locations and to offer help with carpooling. City outings are “meetup” only, accessible by public transportation.

March 18th - Wednesday, High Line Chelsea Manhattan:

Walk amidst a forest of skyscrapers above the city streets. winter grass, old rail tracks, architecture, NYC skyline, art and people. Hike roughly 20 blocks from West 30th street south to Gansevoort Street. Shoot until late afternoon or so. We will find dinner afterward. Note the Park is crowded, and passageways are congested (tripods are discouraged). Links: [Visitor info and map](#) .

Meet 1:00 pm-Ride the West 30 Street elevator (near 500 W. 30 St.) between 10th & 11th Avenues, up to the top of the High Line, - Subway: A, C & E trains to 34 Street. Hike starts at 1:15 PM

Or meet at 3:00 pm-Ride the 23 West Street elevator (near 500 W. 23 St.) between 10th & 11th Avenues, up to the top of the High Line, - Subway: C & E trains to 23 Street.


Meet at 1:15 PM at the main entrance, the Gothic Gate, beyond 25 Street and Fifth Avenue, one and a half blocks from the subway station at 25 Street and 4th. Hike starts at 1:30 PM.

Subway: D, N, and R trains to 25th Street in Brooklyn. Note that 25th Street is an R only, local stop and both the D and N express trains bypass local stops including 25th Street; switch from express to an R train beforehand. [Google map](#) of walk from subway station to the Gothic Gate.


